NOTICE OF TIME CHANGE FOR JUNE OFFICER AND GENERAL ASSEMBLY MEETING: Notice is hereby given that our June general membership meeting will be Tuesday, June 4, 7:00pm (not Sunday, June 16). This calendar change was announced early in the year, as Sunday, June 16, our normal meeting day, is Father's Day. Officers will meet on Tuesday, June 4, 5:30pm.

Last month the General Assembly meeting immediately followed the Officer meeting, so a summary of the April meeting was included with the April Navigator News (Easter was on the third Sunday of the month so the meeting was moved). - Corporate Communion at St. John Neumann, 44800 Warren Rd, Canton, Sunday, June 30, 10:30am. Our Assembly will be joining St. John Neumann Council 16169 for their Corporate Communion, and this may also be a District Corporate Communion for District 14. Note that, as of right now, this is the last day that Fourth Degree Sir Knights can wear regalia at a Color Corps event.
