Charity Poker sessions! We have 19 different people participating this time, with a number of people helping for the first time. We are anticipating this will be as successful as our spring Charity Poker fundraiser. With these two events in the spring and the fall, we have been able to double the amount that we plan to donate to charities that we support. Much thanks to all those that have been able to volunteer to help!

The next event at which we will need help will be the last Adopt-A-Highway of the year on Saturday, September 28. U-M will be at home against Rutgers and MSU will be at home against Indiana. And we should be done in time to catch either (or both) games if we get enough help. In July, we had 13 people show up, which made the work go very quickly. As a reminder, we will gather at 8:00am at the Red Olive at Plymouth and Farmington Roads for breakfast, coffee, chit-chat and sign-in. At 9:00am we will gather for a photo then head out to pick up trash. As I have said in the past, many hands make light work, and getting a dozen people really makes this go quickly. Starting on Monday, September 30, and continuing through Monday, October 21, we will be collecting Coats for Veterans. As I write, we have over 15 confirmed locations where we will have collection bins, including city halls, libraries and churches in Canton, Livonia, Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Wayne and Westland. We are working with our friends at VFW Post 6695 Mayflower-Lt. Gamble, Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter #528 and American Legion Post 391 Passage-Gayde. Further, we will be distributing the items we collect through **Veterans Haven** in Wayne and **House by the Side of the Road** in Ann Arbor. For your convenience, we will also be collecting coats for veterans at our September 15 meeting as well as our October 20 meeting.
