Our next General Assembly meeting will be Sunday, February 16, at Fr. Victor J. Renaud Council Hall. Our Faithful Friar, Fr. Richard, has agreed to do a Memorial Mass for our fallen Sir Knights starting at 3:30pm. The Mass will be upstairs, where the ladies usually meet, as all are invited. Please plan to come early to celebrate this Mass with your fellow Sir Knights and Ladies. Note that this Mass is **NOT** intended to fulfill your Sunday obligation. We will start the General Assembly 5 or 10 minutes after the Mass has ended and we have put away everything that needs to be put away.

With the start of Lent also comes a Friday Knights of Columbus favorite: Fish Fries! Our brothers at Fr. Victor J. Renaud Council will start on February 28 and continue every Friday up to and including Good Friday from 5pm through 7pm. As part of the contribution we make to the council and the hall, we help with cleanup afterwards. We need three or four people every Friday starting at about 6:45pm. This is not hard work. The election process will start in March. We will take nominations in March, April and May, with elections at the close of nominations in May. Please consider running for one of the offices. It is with the help of many people that our assembly is strong and does great work in the community.

On March 26th we will return to the Plymouth-Ann Arbor Elks Lodge, 41700 Ann Arbor Rd E, Plymouth, MI, to help serve steak lunches to veterans from Detroit and Ann Arbor. We start at about 11am. This is always a great event and we usually have at least a dozen Knights of Columbus from our assembly and the surrounding councils helping to serve. This is really easy work and helps to demonstrate the Patriotic value of the Fourth Degree.

On April 5th we will be at the John D. Dingell VA Medical Center, 4646 John R St, Detroit, MI, to serve coffee and donuts to the veterans after the Protestant and Catholic services. We need at least four people to make the event a success, though we can certainly use more. One of our newest members, SK Sal DeSanto, has offered to lead this.
