I am anticipating another opportunity to present one of our chalices to a needy seminarian. I have made arrangements with transitional deacon John Dudek to try and do this in December when he is home for Christmas. John is currently attending Pope St. John XXIII National Seminary in Boston, as he is an older seminarian. More to come as we get closer and get a firm date.

Fall exemplification is just around the corner – Saturday, September 26, 2020. Because of COVID, this exemplification will be online using Zoom (similar to GoToMeeting). As I write this, I believe we have 29 (!!) brothers signed up to be exemplified to the Fourth Degree. (Chris Scanlan and Ed Hurst, along with me, have been busy recruiting.)
