The following items of note occurred at our last general assembly meeting:

- Chris Scanlan was named Sir Knight of the Month. Chris was very active this past month helping to recruit new members to our assembly. *Congratulations, Chris!*
- We voted on the remaining Third Degree brothers that wanted to join our assembly (more on that below).

We had planned on installing officers before the last meeting. Events conspired against us, however, as the Mass of Thanksgiving at the Basilica of Ste. Anne de Detroit kept some of our Color Corps busy before the meeting (including the District Master and me). Additionally, the District Master had a last-minute issue arise that would have kept him from attending. The installation was moved to Wednesday, September 23, and was done online. About half the officers were available to make this last-minute change.

On Saturday, September 26, the District Master held our first ever online exemplification. A total of 98 new Sir Knights were exemplified, with 31 new Sir Knights joining our assembly. This is the largest Michigan District One (and Assembly 1536) exemplification class in a long time. I have sent a couple of communications out on this, so please be sure to welcome the new Sir Knights, and Ladies, when the opportunity arises (especially if you see them at a meeting).

Note that all these new Sir Knights need to be knighted, and I am working with the council Grand Knights to schedule these.
