- The District Master also announced we are the home assembly for the District Sir Knight of the Year and District Lady of the Year, Dennis Lipski and Joyce Hansen.

When we eventually get the "all clear," the District Master plans to join us for a meeting "in person" to present the district awards. I want to thank all in the assembly for their work and help in allowing us to earn this level of recognition.

Also, I want to offer up my apologies for the rather sudden cancellation of the December meeting. When I was informed that Tom Lee's viewing would be the same night as our meeting, I knew I couldn't be in two places at once. Even though the funeral home limited the number of people at the viewing, I felt it was important for me, as the navigator of the assembly, to be present for the family. While I considered having John, the pilot, or Chris, our admiral, run the meeting, a quick look at the agenda showed that there really wasn't much to cover. In short, I appreciate your understanding in this matter. As in the past, we will hit the ground running in January.

Speaking of those next meetings, I have no idea where we will be regarding Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) orders. Getting in touch with any one of us will ensure that we can take those actions that you and your loved ones will allow us to take.

The second insert is a letter from me asking for two things: first, fraternal hours you want credited to the assembly; second (and optional), updates to the Member Management database. Regarding the fraternal hours, every year I ask members to let

me know how many hours they spend on fraternal and charitable activity that they would like credited to the assembly. For the last few years, I've received at most 15 responses. While we keep pretty good track of group activities, such as Color Corps events and Elk Steak Luncheons, we have no idea of the other acts of kindness that you do on a regular basis, such as helping a neighbor rake the leaves or driving a veteran to church. These hours get turned in to Supreme and it helps with the 401(c)3 status.

The optional part is updates to some of the information in Supreme's Member Management database. The information I've included and for which I have asked for updates is a small part of what is in there. However, it is the information that, in many cases, is sadly lacking. Having this information would help us better understand, and celebrate, significant events in the lives of our members. Of course, this is optional, and really up to you if you want to pass along this information.

My ask is that even if you have no fraternal hours to turn in, and even if you choose not to provide any additional information on the Member Management data, you include this sheet in the envelope when you return your dues. This will go to our comptroller, Greg, and he will pass on to me the information as appropriate. Thanks in advance for helping with this.
