Regarding the optional information for which I asked in the letter I had sent to all members with the annual dues, I appreciate all the updates members provided. I have entered as much as I can in Supreme's Membership Management database so that the records will updated for the council, as well. While the contributions were down from the previous year (mainly due to the Coats4Veterans drive in 2019), the hours submitted is about 50% more than last year!
