

- The past few years I have had the opportunity to "sell" poppies for the American Legion at the Plymouth Kroger, and Ace Hardware, and will be this year (see below).
- In doing so I "saw" Patriotism, I saw it in the faces of middle aged and senior men and women especially women. Some were using walkers, some needed help getting out of their car.
- BUT ALL instantly recognized the poppies I held in my hand, and the coffee can I held for donations. Many of that demographic were reaching for their purse or wallet before they even got to me.

Most of the Chalices from our Assembly donated to the Pallottine Fathers in Wyandotte, Michigan.
